

1. Plan to manage the sanitary setback which includes: measures to manage the area, measures to prohibit the storage and mixing of specific chemicals, measures to secure the wellhead from unauthorized access, guidelines for transportation routes.

IDEM requires the establishment of a 200 foot sanitary setback around drinking water wells. US Hwy 24, Grayfox's pump house, a residential street, two houses, and a swale serving as an outlet from a stormwater pond sit within Grayfox subdivision's sanitary setback. The majority of the sanitary setback is owned by the Grayfox Homeowners Association, but two private residences do overlap the setback, as does the highway. As of May 1, 2010, Allen County's online GIS listed those properties and their owners as:

If property owners within the sanitary setback choose to modify their land or landuse, they must comply with Allen County Code Title 3-13-1-1. This code requires that a permit be acquired before construction or rezoning of land use is permitted.

Also within the sanitary setback are two access holes, one for each well and its piping that leads to the well house. These access holes are covered with heavy but unsecured metal covers. Grayfox's two drinking water wells are locked, protected by vehicle impact by concrete posts, but not fenced or secured in any other manner.

Grayfox's pump house sits in the sanitary setback area. The pump house is locked at all times and does not store chemicals. The Alliance of Indiana Rural Water will provide Grayfox with a 'No Trespassing' sign for their pump house. Grayfox's operator reports that the only chemical applied on the Homeowners Association land in the sanitary setback is lawn fertilizer and herbicide. It is not known what private landowners apply on their property, but both private owners will be sent a letter explaining their location within the sanitary setback and ways they can protect the wells from contamination. Grayfox residences have concerns about the amount of algae in the stormwater pond, but the proximity of that pond and it's outlet to the wells has kept the subdivision from applying anything that would address this problem.

US Hwy 24 passes through the sanitary setback and is travelled heavily. The posted speed is 60 mph. The highway's proximity to the wells increases the chance that a spill may threaten Grayfox's wells. Were a spill to occur, the appropriate local and state officials would be notified. If the spill threatened the safety of Grayfox's drinking water, the contingency plan would take effect. A map of the sanitary setback will be sent to Allen County's Highway Department and the local INDOT station and both parties will be asked to limit the use of deicing agents on the parts of US Hwy 24 and the residential road intersecting the sanitary setback area. They will also be asked to avoid piling snow within the sanitary setback area.

Grayfox's operator does not feel that unauthorized access near the wells is a problem, but if it becomes a problem in the future, a fence can be installed.


Aboite Township Fire and Emergency Response Services will receive a copy of this WHPP, including the contingency plan. As needed Grayfox personnel and local and county responders will meet to ensure that all parties have updated WHPA maps and contact information. Each of Grayfox's operators will also have a copy of the contingency plan.

2. A description of the procedures to be used in emergency response to leaks, spills, or illegal discharges

Grayfox has three operators: one from Aqua and two who live in the community. If the wells needed to be shut down because of an emergency, it would take 15 or 60 minutes, depending on which operator was closest. In the event of an interruption of service, a notice will be placed on each home's door and bottled drinking water can be purchased at big box retailers on nearby Illinois Road. Depending on the severity of the emergency, other offices and agencies may need to be contacted, and that information is below. Besides the residents of Grayfox Subdivision, there are no Critical Water Users.

To whom it may concern,

As required by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Grayfox Subdivision is implementing the second phase of its Wellhead Protection Plan. The overarching goal of IDEM's Wellhead Protection Program is to protect community groundwater drinking water supplies from contamination. To accomplish this, IDEM mandates that public water suppliers, like Grayfox Subdivision, take specific steps towards wellhead protection, including: sharing information with local residents and businesses through the forming of a local planning team, mapping the area where underground water is captured by the wells and ultimately provided to the residents as drinking water (the wellhead protection area, or "WHPA"), and identifying potential sources of contamination. This information is used to help prevent groundwater contamination through public education and awareness.

IDEM also requires public water utilities to communicate wellhead protection-related information with local emergency responders like yourselves to facilitate emergency response planning. In the event of a spill or release within the Wellhead Protection Area, a contingency plan has been developed and a copy of this plan is attached to this correspondence or will be sent to your office. The contingency plan includes: a description of the procedures to be used in response to a potential contamination emergency, a map showing the location of the WHPA, and a list of emergency contact telephone numbers.
